PODCAST TRANSCRIPT

Jill Doniger: This is a Bloomberg Money Minute.

Does working from home mean the end of the office? About 61% of financial services executives surveyed by Accenture do not expect all their workers to be called back to the office. 42% are looking at reducing their office footprints. Still, Accenture's Laurie McGraw says this won't happen in the short term.

Laurie McGraw: We're not really seeing an immediate exit from real estate space.

Jill: Part of the reason, social distancing rules.

Laurie: You really can only get to 40-50% occupancy with social distancing and you're really at 100% of the office space.

Jill: Then there's the face-to-face collaboration. McGraw says remote work can complicate things, especially with new hires.

Laurie: Can they work effectively with the team when they've never met the team?

Jill: So don't give away the work clothes yet.

Laurie: We believe that offices will not go away altogether. There may be a reduction in the longer term of footprints.
