IMMERSION

AVENUES immerses users in highly realistic scenarios designed to evoke a response. It uses actors filmed on green screen and stitched into carefully dressed locations. The experience is voice activated so that users have the sense that they are sitting across the table from another person who is looking them in the eye and conversing.




REFLECTION

Next, Accenture brings groups of users together in carefully curated seminars. These interactive workshops prompt reflection on each user's experience and provide an opportunity for group learning.

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Immersive Learning For Corrections

How the metaverse can empower corrections officers to better navigate complex interactions with prison inmates



For Corrections Officers, their work is underscored by the significant challenges faced in high-pressure prison environments. With typically only two weeks of training, officers are often unprepared for the complex and overwhelming situations they encounter, which can lead to safety risks, poor decision-making, and an inability to effectively de-escalate conflicts. This creates a volatile atmosphere in which officers, who are often outnumbered and seen as adversaries, may develop a defensive "us versus them" mindset. Such a mentality heightens tensions for both officers and inmates. It underscores the necessity for thorough training and effective management strategies, enabling better-informed decision-making in a safe environment.

Recognizing inmates as individuals and employing communication over force are crucial for reducing violence and fostering a more harmonious environment. Through de-escalation techniques and improved communication, we can better enhance safety and order.

There are two scenario within the **AVENUES** content library that focus on Corrections. These scenarios provide an opportunity for users to treat prisoners as people, rather than just see them as a problem.



Miller's story provides an opportunity for a newly appointed corrections officer to de-escalate an increasingly tense situation while exploring other beneficial options.

In the scenario, Craig Miller, an inmate on his second year of a five-year sentence for drug distribution, is asked to step out of his cell for a routine check by an officer. He has a reputation for not always being compliant, and his behavior this day seems questionable. It is ultimately up to the user to use their words to keep the situation from escalating into one of violence.

Whitaker and Gibson's story provides users an opportunity to resolve a problem between two inmates before it escalates into violence.

The correctional officer's job has many duties, including remaining vigilant and keeping an eye out for anything out of the ordinary. Some days go smoothly. Today, however, you overhear two inmates shouting at each other -- Reese Whitaker and Sean Gibson. You will use what you know about their characters, and leverage what they care about to keep the temperature of the conversation in a productive place to help keep the prison a safe place.
