[00:00:05]>> In London there are over 2000000 people experiencing or risk of hunger mounted There's also a huge amount of food that is wasted in the u.k. this perfectly good for human consumption we work with normie of volunteers and we distribute food to over a 1000 organizations they're able to get food to people who are experiencing hunger and malnutrition it helps because I'm not working right now and it puts food on the table I'm trying to get myself into a one bedroom but right about now is hard it's hard to be able to concentrate our resources on nice things we need to make sure that the other aspects of the business are is affective fin is sufficient is possible technology being the key driver so we set about work with Accenture Microsoft to have what we call reach me developed on a 6 drive does is it allows us to preplan the routes in the driver then uses the out on their route and then all of the reporting is pushed to us straight away using power.
