I use to operate my computer the screen reader NVDA and I use additionally

one application on the my cell phone the name is Seeing Al. How can I communicate with my colleagues in Spain and around the world? I use the Microsoft Team app and read the subtitles in meetings but only in English. I also use Microsoft Translator app so that my colleagues talk with the microphone becomes text and I can read them. I have two high power digital hearing aids.

When I think about accessibility in my workplace the more important thing for me is the behavior of the people in my department because they really worry about my participation in all of the activities.

To me inclusion is where I can feel like an equal member of the team and also not be afraid to be myself. Nothing for us, without us. Disability inclusion matters.
