My name's Hannah. I identify as she/her. And I'm an operations transformation analyst at Accenture.

I come from South Australia. I'm from a big blended family. My parents got divorced when I was very young, so I'm now one of four. I'm lucky enough to now have two mothers and one father. In my formative years, I struggled to connect with the world around me and I struggled to pick up on my learning.

I was often described as maybe a little bit out of the loop, daydreaming off with the fairies, or quite disruptive in class. This later became apparent that I had a hearing loss in my left side of my head. In other workplaces, sometimes I felt like a burden. I was too loud or too big or not quite the right fit.

I've never felt that way in Accenture. My people lead was fantastic at supporting me. So I have a headset now that does not interfere with my hearing aid, do my job properly. My disability is one very small part of my life, but it is definitely a part of me and I definitely feel like I'm supported.

What I love most about my job is the constant change. Nobody's ever the same. No week's ever the same, and no project's ever the same. At the moment, I'm working in Learning and Development. I feel like I'm presenting real value with the courses I design, and I really enjoy the learning and adaptability I've been given to grow.

If you enjoy change, if you enjoy doing new things, if you enjoy being part of a community and being present, this is definitely the place for you.

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
