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Like their peers in the private sector, public service leaders have begun to embrace a fundamentally different type of government.

They're driving a more digital government, and using innovative technologies like social, mobile, analytics and cloud to transform their organizations.

Accenture's Technology Vision 2015 found that as public service leaders strategize, plan and implement digital government initiatives, they will be influenced by five emerging trends.

The first trend is around a more digital-savvy citizen—one who wants tailored and personalized experiences.

The second trend is intelligent hardware (like embedded sensors) that can help close the gap between the physical and the digital world.

The third trend involves new technology platforms—for better engaging citizens, building new partnerships and, ultimately, delivering better outcomes.

The fourth trend is the use of smarter software—making it easier to turn big data into better decisions and more efficient public services.

For the fifth trend, we're seeing more human-machine collaboration. This means things like wearable devices and smart machines.
